- You're invited to participate in a marine flare demonstration on April 26th, 2008. The location will be in the field behind the A-Dock bath houses and dependent on light winds. A 30-minute instruction session will begin approximately 2 p.m. and will be provided by the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary, followed by a hands-on flare demonstration. Please bring any type of flare you wish to expend, goggles, gloves and a boat hook. Also recommended is wearing a long sleeve shirt. The Middlesex County Volunteer Fire Department will be on hand as well as the Volunteer Rescue Squad, in case of any emergencies. For further information, please contact Arlene at 804-776-6800.
- For those of you who wish to have your vessels inspected, the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary will also be available on April 26th, starting at 9:00 a.m. A booth will be set up in the upper parking lot by the pool.
